What is Respite Care?

The dictionary defines "respite" as a "short period of rest or relief." St. Paul's offers respite stays at St. Paul's Villa, in Bankers Hill, and St. Paul's Plaza, in Eastlake, in the form of sumptuous, restful, guest holidays. Guests can stay at either location in comfortable surroundings, with attentive staff to provide care and comfort as needed. Meals are included and care is planned for each individual's needs. We've had guests stay with us while their home was being remodeled, or so a family could go skiing, and even while a caregiver had a bad cold. We've even had seniors stay as a respite guest so they could get a taste of senior living before committing to full-time residence. At St. Paul's, we often refer to them as short-term guest stays, but no matter what you choose to call your "respite," know we at St. Paul's offer short-term accommodation, no matter the reason, all year round. They include meals, care, activities and so much more, for adults who have care needs from bathing and medication management to full memory support services.

St. Paul's Child Care Program

It may appear odd that St. Paul's Senior Services offers child care. After all, we aren't St. Paul's Senior *and* Child Services. But, actually, the child care program was born with seniors in mind. The child care program was developed in 1997 as a part of the Senior Day program in recognition of the many benefits of intergenerational experiences for both seniors and children. St. Paul's children (8 weeks to 5 years) benefit from small class sizes with staff ratios that are greater than State guidelines. With a focus on social and emotional development, children interact with seniors several times each day to enjoy flag raising, meals and arts and craft projects. Connie Rodriguez, Childcare Supervisor, states "The children learn respect and community awareness. They run to the seniors when they see them and they look forward to their time together."

St. Paul's Partnership Creates Homes for PACE Seniors

St. Paul's Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) is welcoming the opening of a third supportive housing community this summer. Wakeland will provide 59 apartments exclusively for PACE participants who are chronically homeless and in need of permanent housing.

Once construction is completed, the empty apartments need to be transformed into furnished homes. This is made possible only through the efforts and generous support of friends like Leo Rocca, who was inspired to give after first volunteering at St. Paul's Plaza.



"I was drawn to the Wakeland campaign because it would provide housing for homeless seniors who otherwise would not be able to afford it," says Leo. "I had been volunteering with St. Paul's Senior Services for two years and knew the organization to be well managed and good stewards of their resources."



Leo realized that St. Paul's supportive housing partnership with developers was a new model which would marry housing and St. Paul's PACE wraparound services. "The combination of need and St. Paul's leadership convinced me to contribute."

"We are past the halfway point to our goal of \$60,000," said Todd Kaprielian, Executive Director of St. Paul's Senior Services Foundation.

You can help transform 59 apartments into a home by helping to furnish them. It will cost \$500 to equip an apartment with housewares and another \$500 for furniture not provided by the developer. Any remaining contributions will be added to our PACE Basic Needs Fund, a fund of last resort to help PACE participants meet their most basic needs. By combining housing with the all-inclusive health care and social services of PACE, each senior will get the help they need to stay in a clean, safe home. Wakeland provides the housing, we provide the services – and together we champion the solution to San Diego homelessness - one senior at a time.
