Like all retirement and assisted living communities, St. Paul's Senior Services provides homes and care for San Diego's most vulnerable populations. With this in mind, we have implemented the follow procedures to ensure our residents are safe during this current viral outbreak:



GUEST VISITS: All of our buildings are in lockdown, which

means that no one other than St. Paul's staff or residents and PACE participants may come and go. At this time, residents are being asked not to leave the facilities as they are considered at high-risk given their age. Families/responsible persons will be allowed to enter in emergency and/or end-of-life situations; however, we highly encourage families to not visit until further notice. We are setting up systems for families to visit remotely.






