COVID-19 Vaccine Arrives at St. Paul's



What a year this has been! So now, may we all have a happy AND healthy 2021.

The St. Paul's New Year celebrations kicked off early on December 30, 2020 when a team from CVS Pharmacy arrived at the John A. McColl Family Health Center and provided the COVID-19 vaccine to residents and the employees who serve them.

Mr. Eldon Thompson was our first resident to receive the vaccination in front of seven TV stations and two newspaper journalists. He shared that he was one of the first to receive the Polio vaccine in the 1950s, after both his father and brother contracted Polio. Now, thanks to the dedication of scientists, Mr. Thompson was able to be one of the first seniors in San Diego to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, while Sigrid Aquino, RN, was our first employee to receive the vaccination. St. Paul's is proud to be a part of this historic event and to be one of the first facilities to receive the vaccine.

Over the last few months, St. Paul's has worked tirelessly to advocate at state and national levels to prioritize seniors and long-term care employees to receive the COVID-19 vaccination. We are not done yet, as we continue to work with the State of California to advocate for our St. Paul's PACE participants and employees who were not recognized in the first round of vaccinations; we are currently working hard to enroll St. Paul's PACE in the California COVID-19 Vaccination Program.

We give thanks for the staff who have, and continue to, work tirelessly to keep our seniors safe and free of COVID-19. The safest place for St. Paul's seniors is in our communities or protected by the oversight of PACE. We thank the donors and many volunteers who have helped us weather the COVID-19 storm with Sunshine for Seniors, cards and messages, donations of PPE, and funds to help with purchases of PPE.

Our three Boards of Directors have been an amazing source of support during these challenging times. I am most grateful for their commitment and presence at any and all times to meet, zoom, and teleconference, all to continue our mission and fulfill good business practices.

Our St. Paul's team has and will continue to prevail, and for that I am most humbly grateful.

A 'Shot' of Hope: St. Paul's Receives COVID-19 Vaccine

There was no better way to end 2020 at St. Paul's than with a few dozen "doses of hope" that came in the form of the COVID-19 vaccine. On December 30, 2020, St. Paul's John A. McColl Family Health Center received the vaccine from CVS Pharmacy. St. Paul's other communities – including Manor, Villa and Plaza – are scheduled to receive the first dose in mid-January.

To celebrate this historic moment for St. Paul's, one willing resident, Mr. Eldon Thompson, along with frontline staff and Administrators, were vaccinated in front of several local news stations to show the San Diego community the importance of being vaccinated.

While St. Paul's has faced a challenging year due to COVID-19, there is a glimmer of hope as our seniors and staff anticipate the day when they can hug their loved ones again and share a smile without a mask. December 30, 2020 will be remembered as a day of hope and new beginnings for St. Paul's.

Liza Codina, the Director of Nursing at St. Paul's Nursing and Rehab Center, explained, "It was a day of celebration, with all of the staff members rejoicing, cheering and clapping their hands when they received the vaccine. I felt relieved and so grateful for this opportunity to be one of the early recipients of this vaccine."

St. Paul's PACE Essential Needs "Drive-Thru" Event



St. Paul's PACE collects essential items for low-income seniors through the St. Paul's Essential Needs Drive (S.P.E.N.D.). This campaign allows each PACE clinic to have a year-round supply of every-day goods and personal care items available to give to our participants who have difficulty purchasing things we often take for granted, like soap, tooth paste, socks, and canned goods.

The campaign began on National Make a Difference Day with a drive-thru donation event at St. Paul's PACE Reasner. Friends of St. Paul's, industry partners, donors, and employees came by the clinic

to drop off essential personal care items, making it a great start to an annual campaign. Even local radio personality LaDona Harvey from Newsradio 600 KOGO came out to support the cause!

The S.P.E.N.D campaign continued from October through December for the community to drop off donations. While many seniors received items for Christmas, more St. Paul's PACE participants will continue to benefit from these donations throughout the year.

St. Paul's PACE Center Director Carol Castillon noted, "We were able to provide items to more than 100 PACE participants with much-needed essential items and food, thanks to the generosity of our partners and community. For some of our seniors, this translated to a sense of hope and togetherness during a time where they feel the most alone and isolated. The smiles on their faces said it all!"

St. Paul's PACE serves more than 1,000 homebound seniors in San Diego, providing health care and supportive services. The S.P.E.N.D. campaign is just another way we serve these amazing people.



A St. Paul's Child Care Reunion...12 Years in the Making


What started out as a quick and simple holiday donation to St. Paul's from our friends in the Quieter Home Program and Aircraft Noise Mitigation department at the San Diego International Airport turned into a joyful reunion for one St. Paul's Child Care teacher, her former student, and his mom.

On December 17, 2020, when "Santa's helpers" Catherine Darby and her son Bryce delivered holiday goods to St. Paul's Community Care Center, they had no idea they would also be delivering an early Christmas "gift" to one of our long-time pre-school teachers! Knowing Bryce had attended St. Paul's Child Care many years earlier and that "Miss Liliana" was one of his favorite teachers, St. Paul's Craig Smith arranged for Miss Liliana to meet a "fan" in the lobby for a surprise reunion.

Miss Liliana was overwhelmed with emotion to see both Bryce and his mom and had to take a moment to catch her breath. Unfortunately due to COVID-19 restrictions, everyone had to limit their reunion to big smiles, socially-distant conversations, and air hugs. Miss Liliana joked to Bryce that, "While I'm shrinking, he's growing!" Catherine expressed, "It was so great seeing Miss Liliana the day we dropped off the items. It brought back a flood of wonderful memories for Bryce as well."

Bryce enrolled in St. Paul's Child Care in June 2008, when he was nine months old, and graduated from the program in June 2011. Catherine explains why St. Paul's Child Care made such a significant impact on her son saying, "As none of Bryce's grandparents were living in San Diego at that time, we liked the Intergenerational Program where he had experiences with grandparent age folks. I believe, as a result of this program, Bryce developed into an independent thinker. He developed a strong ability to express himself and a curiosity for the world around him that has led to his interest in the sciences, particularly marine biology."

Bryce is now a 14-year-old freshman at Clairemont High School, where he plays on their water polo team. Bryce and his parents, Catherine and Ben, still keep in touch with parents and students they met at St. Paul's, some of whom have become lifelong friends. In fact, two of Bryce's pals now, Stella Tomer and Logan Sharp, who also attend Clairemont High, were part of his class of 2011 at St. Paul's. In addition to her positive personal experience with the intergenerational program, Catherine recommended St. Paul's Senior Services to her department as a donation recipient because of the devastating impact COVID-19 and its restrictions were having on senior communities everywhere. The donation was also her way of acknowledging and taking care of all the seniors in her life and having a chance to say, "Thank you, St. Paul's and St. Paul's teachers, for giving Bryce an amazing start!"







Making House Calls:

St. Paul's PACE Roving Clinic 2.0 Campaign Reached its Goal!


Thank you to St. Paul's generous supporters "driving" our PACE Roving Clinic 2.0 Campaign donations up; we have finally arrived at our fundraising goal of \$600,000.

None of this would have been possible without the tremendous backing from Dorothea Laub, who underwrote one Roving Clinic with a \$300,000 gift.

The remainder of the proceeds came from our SUMMERFEST "Stay-at-Home" Non-Event that raised approximately \$200,000, as well as our 2020 Holiday and Giving Tuesday Appeals. These funds will allow St. Paul's to acquire two new PACE Roving Clinics in order to serve our home-bound seniors in a safe and fully equipped mobile environment.

Each wheelchair accessible vehicle will be outfitted with state-of-the-art health care diagnostic equipment and a private, comfortable exam space for our seniors. Dr. Victor Lee, St. Paul's PACE Medical Director explains, "We are in discussions with a company located in California about building our first roving clinic. We anticipate receiving the first vehicle sometime in the next few months!"

Carol Castillon, the Center Director for St. Paul's PACE Reasner, adds, "The additional PACE Roving Clinics will allow our health care teams to make even more critical 'house calls' to our frail, home-bound PACE seniors, who even before the COVID-19 pandemic, found it difficult to make it into the clinics for medical care. We are very excited to have this option available to those seniors."



Girl Scouts Donate Hand-Made Activity Mats to St. Paul's Memory Care Residents

The dedicated young women of Girl Scout Troup 4329, located in Serra Mesa, generously donated 33 handmade dementia activity mats for our Memory Care residents at St. Paul's Villa and St. Paul's Plaza.

The special project was a part of the Silver Award, which is the highest award a cadet troop can earn. The Silver Award gives youth a chance to demonstrate they are leaders dedicated to improving and making a difference in their community. Seven troop members created these one-of-a-kind dementia mats with little-to-no help from their parents.

Plaza Activities

- 1. **Crystal Singing Bowls:** A fun activity that harnesses the calming effects of harmonic tones. Set of seven is \$600, but each bowl is \$80 \$110.
- 2. **Hand Drums:** Djembe drums produce a wide variety of sounds, making it a most versatile instrument. In concert with several others, the drum can create memorable group activity. Drums range from \$30 \$100 each depending on the size; the Plaza hopes to have 8 djembe drums.
- 3. **Hand held percussion instruments:** Adding to the djembe drums, the activities team is also looking for a number of maracas and other similar instruments. \$10 -\$15 per set.

Sunshine for Seniors - \$100 x5

During the shelter-in-place order, seniors throughout St. Paul's are in need of large print puzzle books, large piece jigsaw puzzles and art supplies (such as coloring pencils, markers, paint brushes and paints).

Plaza Sound System - \$1,000

The Plaza's Mathes Conference Room is regularly used for resident-focused events as well as support to corporate functions, such as Board meetings and staff retreats. These functions would benefit from an upgrade to the sound system.

Shade Covers - \$400 each = \$4,000

The Plaza needs shade covers for outdoor patios, especially on the 2nd and 4th floors. Residents have been subject to a 'stay at home' order and would like to get out for some sun - however, it is very warm on our decks and some shade is needed. Several matching aluminum solar LED outdoor umbrellas will be used by our residents where we have no shading on our 2nd and 4th floor terraces and in the front of the building on the piazza. One large purchase is recommended so they will all match and enhance the ambiance.

Manor Patio Heaters - \$450 each

Two movable patio heaters to facilitate outdoor gatherings during the pandemic. Cost for each complete with propane tank and cover is \$450.
